


Description of works. Context One Archaeological Services Ltd (COAS) carried out a programme of archaeological works during groundworks associated with the construction of the new Exe Estuary Trail at Tremlett's Boatyard, Odham's Wharf, Ebford (see Figures 1 and 2). A desk-based appraisal was carried out prior to monitoring in order to place the development area into its historic and archaeological context. The work consisted of map regression based on the Ordnance Survey maps and the Tithe Map(s) and Apportionments, as well as aerial photographs and records held by the Devon Historic Environment Record (see Figures 1 and 2).				
On 20 October a walkover survey of the Site was carried out and this was later followed with a metal detecting survey on 28 October 2010. During the walkover survey it was observed that the ground along the route of the trail comprised mainly modern made-up ground, apart from the areas of vegetation that had not yet been removed and the concrete floor of Tremlett's Boatyard. The subsequent metal detecting survey did not recover any notable finds.
