Archaeological Watching Brief Two Proposed Wind Turbines, Mains of Ethie, Inverkeilor, Angus

Introduction (Illus 1 and 4)

This archaeological watching brief on the ground stripping for the two wind turbine plinths was carried out for Mr Duncan Gray to satisfy the archaeological condition on the planning consent for this development, as noted by Aberdeenshire Archaeological Service in the condition attached to Planning Application 11/00374/FULL dated 11th November 2011. It was undertaken by the author on Thursday 2nd February 2012 (Site Code ETH01), weather conditions were bright, cold and sunny.

Archaeological Background (Illus 2, 3)

Mains of Ethie Farm lies on a headland overlooking Lunan Bay in an area which is very rich in the cropmarks of Prehistoric and later settlement (RCAHMS 1978). St Murdoch's Chapel (formerly Ethie Parish Church) lies to the South East of the site for the two wind turbines (Ibid, 29).

Watching Brief

Turbine 1 (Illus 5, 6 and 7)

The site of this wind turbine lies 250m NW of Mains of Ethie Farm at 61.17 metres above Ordnance Datum. The area of the turbine plinth, which measured 5m by 5m, was stripped of a soil which varied in depth between 0.30m and 0.35m. This dark brown silty clay (ploughsoil) overlay a blue grey rock and yellow clay surface which was of natural origin. There was no sign of any archaeological deposits or features.

Turbine 2 (Illus 8, 9 and 10)

The site of this wind turbine lies 190m North of Mains of Ethie Farm at 63.81 metres above Ordnance Datum. The area of the turbine plinth, which measured 5m by 5m, was stripped of a soil which varied in depth between 0.80m at its eastern end to 0.45m at its Western end. At the eastern side of the plinth trench this dark brown silty clay (ploughsoil) overlay a blue green sandy clay which represented the natural subsoil, the soil at the Western end of the stripped area overlay a deposit of natural brown sand and stones. There was no sign of any archaeological deposits or features.

Conclusions

Montoring of the two wind turbine sites at Mains of Ethie Farm located no archaeological deposits or features.








